Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Spring Term 1 2024. The St Johns Team and I offer you all our very best wishes for the New Year.

Spring Term is a very short term, (Term 1 - five weeks and Term 2 - five weeks 3 days). In this short term, teaching happens and learning takes place so that pupils can make progress and build on prior knowledge. The teaching and learning continues at pace as there are fewer school days to deliver the curriculum and build enrichment opportunities so that learning can take place. The role of parents and carers is to ensure that pupils start the school day with the opportunity to be ' the best that they can be..'. Therefore, it is really important that the pupils come to school each day, on time and ready to learn.

Whole school attendance at the end of the Autumn Term (4th September to 20th December) was 95.3%. For the first week of this Spring Term, **570 minutes** of learning were lost due to pupils arriving late for school. The impact of a late arrival is that a child arriving late,

can become upset and not ready to start their days learning. Staff are then tied up recording their arrival, escorting pupils to class, 1:1 settling them into the classroom or 1:1 filling learning gaps due to time missed. This is not a calm orderly start to the day for pupils nor staff. The detrimental impact of lateness applies to all year groups, Nursery to Year 6, and we ask your help in ensuring your child arrives at school ready to start their school day.

The front and side gate open at 8.35am and close at 8.45am. The School Attendance Officer is tasked by Oxford Education Authority, me as Acting Headteacher and the School Governors to challenge and investigate lateness / recurring lateness, along with absence and patterns of absence, as this is not in the best interest of our pupils.

During this term, at the start of 'Childrens Mental Health week', will see the opening of the 'New Harbour'. The building at the back of the school that has been created to enrich our Pastoral / SEND offers for all pupils and the wider school community. Our Pastoral offer helps those pupils and families that have a need for additional support to fully access Learning at St Johns School. As a school we are very excited and pleased to be able to extend the facilities available so that opportunities for the school community are enriched in a bespoke setting.

As ever, **our Christian Vision** is inclusive and aspirational for all members of our School Community. We aspire for all -children and adults- to grow as children of God, to be the best they can be. We want all to have respect for themselves and each other, along with a wonder and curiosity for God's creation. **'They will lift up their wings and soar like eagles' Isaiah 40:31 '...embracing life in all its fullness.' John 10:10**

Our vision reflects the ambition of the school community to care for others and achieve excellence. Morning drop-off:

The school gates will be open from 8.35am, with leaders welcoming the children at the gates.

The register will be taken at 8.45am and all children will be expected to be settled in class by this time. Lessons will start promptly at 8.50am.

Year 1, 2, 3 and 6 children enter via the side gate (opposite the play park) Nursery, Reception, Year 4 and Year 5 children enter via the front gate.

Reception parents will be invited to drop the children off at the classroom door via the reception garden.

After-school pick-up:

The school day will end at 3.15pm and parents are asked to pick children up from the outside classroom doors.

Beach Club After-school Childcare Provision:

The after-school Beach Club provision will operate from 3.15pm to 5.15pm from September 2023.

Family Holidays in Term Time

Attendance regulations make clear that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

We do not authorise family holidays in term time, long weekends, or special visits/trips/half days for example. At the end of the school year we have blocked INSET days to support families in booking holidays before other schools across the country break up.

Changes to national regulations (from September 2022) has meant that the county council will issue penalty notices (fines) where unauthorised absences or holidays are taken in term time.




